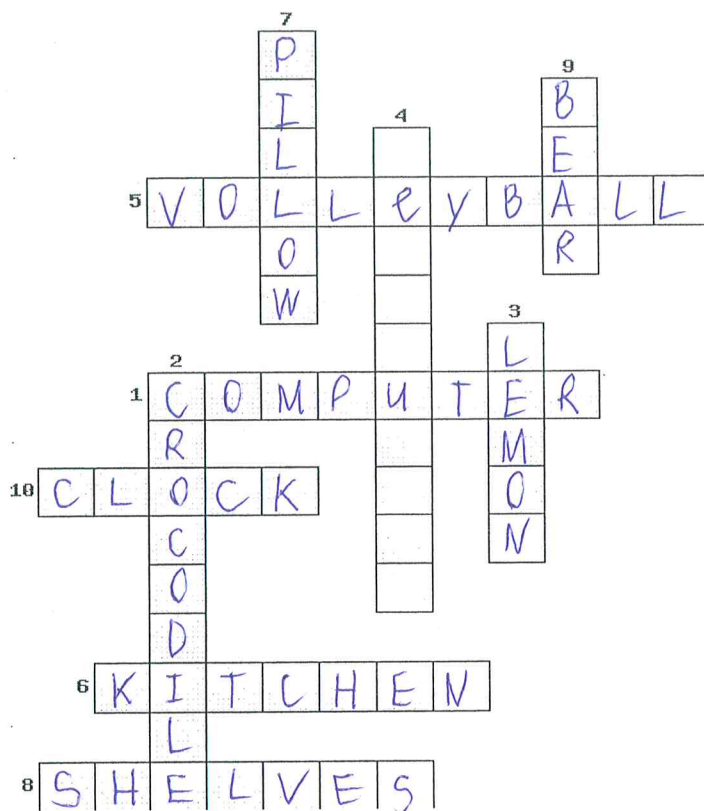

Students can choose to stay at home, but they usually come to school because they love it! Students are three to eighteen years old and don't do homework or tests. They don't study in traditional classes either – teachers work with every student to decide what to study, so each student learns about things that really interest them. Some students prefer to work alone, some work on projects in groups. They choose when to hang out with friends or play.

**B**

Over 2,000 young people have most of their classes at a stadium in Buenos Aires, Argentina, and it's even got a university. The stadium is the home of the River Plate football team, although people do other sports there too, like basketball and swimming. Students study typical subjects, but sometimes school finishes early because there is football practice. Children all over the world have grown up with technology which allows them to play almost any instrument, create their own songs and release them on the internet. The internet's also created the potential for people to collaborate on online musical projects, so new sounds and ways of making music can be easily shared. The Virtual Choir is one example of this; more than a thousand voices brought together by the internet to create a digital choir.

At the same time though, we must remember that there are many young people without access to either iPhones or pianos. So what happens to them? Well, in the same way as people have been doing for millennia, they make music in any way they can; by whistling, clapping or just hitting a box with their hands.
